***“Teens and Technology: Dating in a Digital World”***

It can be difficult for professionals to keep up with the ever changing social media world of adolescence. This presentation will review social media apps and digital norms to foster understanding and communication between adults and teens. In addition, the presentation will address the dynamics of adolescent digital dating abuse, which is the use of digital communication to bully, harass, stalk or intimidate a partner.

***“Building Resiliency with Teens”***

Adverse childhood experiences (ACEs) are common for youth but it can be challenging to translate the science of ACEs for a teen audience. This presentation will address ACEs for teens, including potential behavioral and health outcomes. In addition, the presentation will explore practical tools as well as digital resources designed to build collaborative, “power with” relationships between adults and teens and to increase resiliency in youth.

***“Juvenile Law 101”***

This presentation is intended to inform students, parents, and/or educators about the juvenile justice system. We will discuss topics that include a basic overview of juvenile court, common offenses committed by juveniles, and the consequences for committing those offenses. We will also address some serious issues that are affecting today's teens and resources available to help with those issues. Those topics include the heroin/opioid epidemic, human trafficking, online dangers, and teen dating violence.

***“The Side Effects of Sexting”***  
*Zachary Imwalle, Assistant Prosecuting Attorney, Franklin County Prosecutor's Office*

It has become increasingly common for juveniles to use their devices to exchange sexually explicit pictures and videos (“sexting”). In Ohio, sexting with a juvenile can be charged as a felony under the current child pornography laws. Many juveniles, parents, and educators are not fully aware that sexting is illegal and the potential consequences for doing so. The goal of this presentation is to provide the information necessary to prevent juveniles from being charged with serious sexting-related offenses.
